Amanda would like to invite all the student leaders to come to the conference as attendees, consider tabling at lunch, especially the identity-based clubs who may have a social justice tie in as well. Amanda wants to make this a huge campus event that's on the district's agenda. They have booked Victor Rios for the conference. He's an amazing speaker and Panella and Stover both assign Victor Rios as readings for their classes. He's an astute and empathetic speaker on the lives of young black and latino men. They come from low-income, high danger context of growing up. He helps the world understand the pressure these men feel growing up. He immigrated from Mexico when he was young, and the theme of the conference this year is Migration. Someone of his caliber is not cheap so Amanda is asking for assistance across the district to provide funding for Victor Rios.

Toni: There is more budget available in the student center fee. Petaluma Council was allotted \$3841, this can be used on events that take place in the student center.

Amanda, mentions that the event takes place in the student center and clock tower plaza.

**Kaila suggests that allocating funding for the conference in general would allow for the student center funds to be used.**

**Jared moves to amend the motion to provide \$3400 to fund breakfast and lunch. Edward seconds.**

**Ken mentions that there might be other expenses we need. Max mentions hoping to buy new supplies for the gaming center. Ken also mentioned that the original ask was for a thousand dollars.**

**Max argues that we could provide fewer funds to We The Future and still have funds for what we are planning.**
